In an essay of 5-6 double-spaced pages (Chicago citation style in Times New Roman 12-pt. font), write a commentary that addresses and elaborates *one* of the following quotations from *Roman Catholics and Shi'i Muslims* (Bill and Williams). In your essay, draw especially on insights from that book, but also incorporate perspectives from other assigned readings, lectures, and class discussions.

In your answer, in a final separate paragraph, consider the ways that the particulars of your discussion raise both possibilities for as well as obstacles to interreligious dialogue between

Roman Catholics and Shia.

<u>A Note on the Audience</u>: You are writing this essay for your peer-students with little or no background to Catholicism or Shi'ism.

Either

- (1) "In this book, we seek to wrestle with issues such as the relationship between God and humanity; the continuum between life and death; the dialectic between war and peace; the gap between rich and poor; the significance of religious ceremony and drama; the place of saints, martyrs, and confessors; the role of the inner (batin) as oppose to the outer (zahir) reality of humankind; the role of redemptive suffering; the relationship between religion and politics; and the similarities and differences in legal systems" (Bill and Williams, p. 4).
- Reflect on *any three* of those themes, analyzing the <u>similarities</u> and <u>differences</u> in the two traditions.
- In a final separate paragraph, consider the ways that the three aspects you have compared raise both *possibilities for* as well as *obstacles to* interreligious dialogue between Roman Catholics and Shia.

Or

- (2) On page 143 of the "Conclusion" to *Roman Catholics and Shi'i Muslims*, authors Bill and Williams provide an eight-point list of <u>similarities</u> in the belief and practice of the two traditions.
- Choose *any three* of these eight aspects and clarify through your commentary with *concrete examples* how the two religious traditions are *similar* in these facets. In the spirit of a more nuanced comparison, also highlight the major *differences* between the

two traditions on these points.
